CERTIFICATE OF DETERMINATION

STATE of MICHIGAN
County of Jackson

The Board of Canvassers of the County of Jackson, having Ascertained and Canvassed the Votes cast for and against the Vandercook Lake Public Schools Bond Proposal, at the Special Election held on the 6th day of November, two thousand seven.

Do Hereby Certify and Determine:

That the Vandercook Lake Public Schools bond proposal:

Shall the Vandercook Lake Public Schools, County of Jackson, Michigan, borrow the principal sum of not to exceed Four Million Five Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$4,535,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds for the purpose of defraying the cost of:

- remodeling, furnishing, refurbishing, equipping and reequipping School District buildings, including boiler replacement, roofing, security/building entrances, safety, window replacement, energy conservation improvements and lighting;
- constructing, equipping and furnishing additions, including expansion of the cafeteria, at Vandercook Lake High School/Middle School;
- acquiring, developing and improving sites, including parking improvements, outdoor athletic facilities, fields and structures;
- acquiring and installing technology infrastructure and equipment in School District buildings?

The School District estimates that the debt millage levy required to retire the bonds of the District currently outstanding and proposed by this ballot proposal will not exceed 5.20 mills (\$5.20 per \$1,000 of taxable value), which represents a 1.00 mill increase over the 2007 School District levy. The estimated millage to be levied in 2008 to service this issue of bonds is 2.17 mills (\$2.17 per \$1,000 of taxable value) and the estimated simple average annual millage rate required to retire the bonds of this issue is 2.13 mills (\$2.13 per \$1,000 of taxable value). The bonds may be payable in not to exceed twenty-five (25) years from the date of issue. If the School District borrows from the State to pay debt service on the bonds of this issue, the School District may be required to continue to levy mills beyond the term of the bonds to repay the State.

(Under state law, bond proceeds may not be used to pay teacher or administrator salaries, routine maintenance costs or other School District operating expenses.)
