PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO SECTION 8.8 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, TO CHANGE THE NUMBER OF COUNCIL MEMBERS REQUIRED TO CONSTITUTE A QUORUM.

This amendment reduces the quorum requirement for meetings of the city council from four members of the city's seven-member council to a majority of council members then serving on the council.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO SECTION 11.1 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, TO PROVIDE THAT THE EXISTING POLICE DEPARTMENT AND FIRE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT BE COMBINED INTO A PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENT WITHOUT AN APPROVING VOTE OF THE MAJORITY OF CITY VOTERS VOTING ON THE ISSUE.

This amendment will amend Section 11.1 of the charter of the city of Jackson, to provide that the existing police and fire departments will not be combined into a public safety department without an approving vote of the majority of city voters voting on the issue.

This proposal will allow the school district to levy 17.0617 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive a portion of its revenue per pupil foundation allowance and renews millage that will expire with the 2010 tax levy.

If approved, it is estimated that the levy of 1.25 mills will provide revenue of \$83,837* in the first calendar year of the levy.

The tax revenue received by the Township will be disbursed to the Township of Parma and the Parma Sandstone Fire Department for fire protection (including First Responder emergency medical service), and operation and maintenance of the fire department, and fire department vehicles, apparatus, equipment and housing purposes.

MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSITION 1.2500 MILLS FOR TOWNSHIP FIRE PROTECTION (INCLUDING FIRST RESPONDER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE), AND OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, AND FIRE DEPARTMENT VEHICLES, APPARATUS, EQUIPMENT AND HOUSING

Shall the previous voted increase in the authorized charter millage for ad valorem taxes for the Charter Township of Sandstone currently 1.2042 mills (1.2042 per \$1,000 of taxable value) be renewed and levied in the years 2011-2016, both inclusive, and shall an additional 0.0458 mill (0.0458 per \$1,000 of taxable value) be approved and levied to restore previous millage reductions under the "Headlee Amendment" since this millage was last approved, resulting in a levy of 1.25 mills (\$1.25 per \$1,000 of taxable value), subject to reduction as provided by law, upon all taxable real and personal property within the Township?

If approved, it is estimated that the levy of 1.25 mills will provide revenue of \$197,482 in the first calendar year of the levy.

The tax revenue received by the Township will be disbursed to the Charter Township of Sandstone and the Parma Sandstone Fired Department for fire protection (including First Responder emergency medical service), and operation and maintenance of the fire department, and fire department vehicles, apparatus, equipment and housing purposes.
