**CONCORD COMMUNITY SCHOOLS
BONDING PROPOSAL**

Shall Concord Community Schools, Jackson County, Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed Five Million Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$5,020,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds therefor for the purpose of:

erecting and equipping a secure entrance to the elementary/middle school building; remodeling, equipping and re-equipping and furnishing and refurnishing school buildings; and preparing, equipping, developing and improving sites?

The following is for informational purposes only:

The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2018 is 1.58 mills (\$1.58 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation). The maximum number of years the bonds of any series may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is twenty-three (23) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 2.02 mills (\$2.02 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).

The school district does not expect to borrow from the State to pay debt service on the bonds. The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$1,880,000. The total amount of qualified loans currently outstanding is \$0. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited, and the proceeds cannot be used for repair or maintenance costs, teacher, administrator or employee salaries, or other operating expenses.)

BUILDING AND SITE SINKING FUND TAX PROPOSAL

Shall the Vandercook Lake Public Schools, County of Jackson, be authorized to levy three (3) mills (\$3.00 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation), for a period of five (5) years, from July 1, 2017 through 2021, to create a building and site sinking fund to be used for the purpose of the purchase of real estate for sites for, and the construction or repair of, school buildings, for school security improvements, or for the acquisition or upgrading of technology, and for other purposes, to the extent permitted by law? This millage would provide estimated revenues to the Vandercook Lake Public Schools of approximately Two Hundred Seventy-Three Thousand One Hundred Eighty-Seven Dollars (\$273,187) during the first year of levy.

This proposal will allow the intermediate school district to continue to levy special education millage previously approved by the electors.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Washtenaw Intermediate School District, Michigan, be increased by .9719 mill (\$0.9719 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 8 years, 2018 to 2025, inclusive, to provide funds for the education of students with a disability; the estimate of the revenue the intermediate school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2018 is approximately \$15,200,000 from local property taxes authorized herein (this is a renewal of millage that expired with the 2017 tax levy)?
